Best Management Practices (BMPs) for Stormwater Protection

Stormwater enters our storm drainage system and discharges directly to the Rio Grande *without treatment*. Wastes should not be disposed into our storm drainage system. It is important to keep these pollutants from entering our waterways.

Pollutants of concern include (but are not limited to):sediment, solvents, trash, metals, chemicals such as wood preservatives, oils, hydraulic fluid, fuels, and grease.

Best Management Practices

Below are suggested practices to prevent negative impacts to stormwater quality.

- Educating employees on these BMPs is key to proper implementation.
- Reduce inventory of raw materials when and where possible.
- Store construction materials such that rainwater will not carry rust, chemicals from treated wood, or fine materials off the property.
- Drainage from contractor yards should never directly enter streets, gutters, ditches, arroyos, or storm drains.
- Frequently check all vehicles and equipment are free of leaks.
- Any leaks that occur should be immediately cleaned with an absorbent material and disposed of properly.
- Used petroleum and automotive fluids should be recycled or disposed of properly.
- A catch pan should be placed below chemical containers to prevent spills from coming into contact with stormwater.
- All petroleum products, paints, and other chemicals should be kept in sealed and properly labeled containers, elevated on a pallet or similar, and stored indoors or under cover, away from potential contact with rain and stormwater.



- > Metal and treated wood materials:
 - Preferably, store indoors.
 - When storing indoors is not feasible, store under a covered area to prevent contact with rainfall.
 - **Elevate** from ground on pallets or similar to prevent contact with stormwater run on.
- If large piles of fine or lightweight soils or sand are stored, periodically wet down surfaces of piles to prevent wind transport.
