Best Management Practices (BMPs) for Stormwater Protection

Stormwater enters our storm drainage system and discharges directly to the Rio Grande *without treatment*. Wastes should not be disposed into our storm drainage system. It is important to keep these pollutants from entering our waterways.

Pollutants of concern include (but are not limited to): fats, oils, grease, degreasers, sediment, trash, and bacteria.

Best Management Practices

Below are suggested practices to prevent negative impacts to stormwater quality.

- Educating employees on these BMPs is key to proper implementation.
- > Recycle used oil and grease.
- ➤ Never pour oil or grease into sinks, floor drains, and especially not into parking lots, streets, storm drains, ditches, or arroyos.
- If mopping is necessary for cleaning food or grease spills, discharge mop water through a grease trap.
- Never dump mop water outside.
- Clean equipment, floor mats, filters, and garbage cans in a mop sink, wash rack, or floor drain connected to a grease trap.
- If a septic system is in place, install a grease trap before water enters septic tank and perform regular maintenance to prevent overflow.
- Post signs for no littering and have sufficient trashcans in parking lots.
- Never discharge anything into parking lots except clean water.
- Never wash out grease bins.

Only Rain in the Drains!



- Keep grease and trash in closed bins and never let them overflow.
- Take precautionary measures before cleaning parking lots to ensure that water from cleaning activities does not enter storm drains, streets, ditches, or arroyos.
- Frequently remove trash from parking lots to prevent floatables from entering stormwater.
- Keep grease and trash in closed bins and never let them overflow.
- Spills while transferring grease into bins happen; immediately clean spills, grease bins, and areas surrounding grease bins using an absorbent and sweeping.
- Post signs for no illegal dumping around trash and grease bin enclosures.
- Never clean areas around grease bins by washing off with soaps or degreasers unless there is no chance of this running off onto streets, storm drains, ditches, or arroyos; clean with an absorbent and dry sweeping.
