



Scrap Metal Recycling

Best Management Practices (BMPs) for Stormwater Protection

Stormwater enters our storm drainage system and discharges directly to the Rio Grande *without treatment*. Wastes should not be disposed into our storm drainage system. It is important to keep these pollutants from entering our waterways.

Scrap metal pollutants include (but are not limited to): oil, gasoline, diesel, transmission fluid, coolant, solvents, trash, metals and grease.

Best Management Practices

Below are suggested practices to prevent negative impacts to stormwater quality.

- Educate and train all employees about pollution prevention measures and goals, conduct annual refreshers.
- Never pour automotive fluids down storm drains or on the ground
- Clean spills and leaks immediately using dry cleanup methods.
- Use catch pans under leaking vehicles until drained or repaired; do not allow to overflow.
- Containers of used automotive fluids should be sealed, elevated on pallets, stored in a covered area, labeled, and have a drip pan or other secondary containment.
- Recycle used oil, transmission fluid, antifreeze, other automotive fluids, and lead acid batteries at approved locations.
- Inspect used batteries for leaks or damage, and store used batteries in leak-proof containers in a covered area.
- Before storing or crushing vehicles, empty all fluids, and remove brake pads, tires, and mercury switches.
- Clean parts inside or under a covered area surrounded by berms or a sump.

Only Rain in the Drains!

- > Perform loading/unloading in areas that are covered, hard-surfaced, and bermed.
- > Store materials inside when possible, or outside in a covered area and elevated on pallets.
- Pave or concrete stockpile areas, and install berms to prevent stormwater from flowing through.
- Regularly inspect around storage containers and stored vehicles for leaks or spills.
